The best book recs we've gotten

This list comes from **Deborah** and **Sarah**.

- 1. <u>Fairest</u> by Gail Carson Levine: a Snow White retelling of sorts, in which our heroine is nowhere near the fairest of all, but has the loveliest voice in a kingdom where music plays an integral part in daily life. (Also check out <u>Ella Enchanted</u> and <u>The Two Princesses of Bamarre</u>.)
- 2. <u>Sabriel</u> by Garth Nix (and the whole <u>Old Kingdom</u> series): In the Old Kingdom, the dead refuse to stay dead. After Sabriel's father goes missing, she must journey through that perilous land and save him from a sinister magical entity. To do so, she has to enter Death itself.
- 3. Howl's Moving Castle by Diana Wynne Jones: a beloved classic.

Cursed by a witch, Sophie seeks out the traveling castle of the infamous Wizard Howl. She discovers there's more to him--and herself-than meets the eye. Sophie must confront the witch to save not only herself but Howl too. (We also love the movie!)

- 4. <u>Chalice</u> by Robin McKinley: Young beekeeper Mirasol is suddenly named the new Chalice (a kind of sorcerer) for her community. She must quickly learn the duties and help bind the new Master to the land and his people. But he's a Fire Priest who can't touch anything without burning it....
- 5. <u>I Am Not a Serial Killer</u> by Dan Wells: John Cleaver has the classic traits of a serial killer but is determined not to become one. His unique insight allows him to help the police solve a mystery and save his town from a monster. Starts a <u>series</u>.
- 6. <u>Dracula</u> by Bram Stoker: Does this book need an introduction? Deborah's sister read it to her when she was 9. Sarah read it during college after she randomly found it in the college's library.
- 7. The Books of Bayern series by Shannon Hale: It begins with *The Goose Girl*, a retelling of the fairy tale in which a princess can talk to birds. Certain characters are able to speak the language of various elements and control fire, water, air, or learn secrets through trees. Each book takes you on an exciting adventure!
- 8. <u>Thief of Time</u> by Terry Pratchett: I (Sarah) asked my professor which Discworld book to start with, and he said this one. I loved it so much that I read a good chunk of the series. I think I like the <u>City Watch</u> books the best, but I will always have a special fondness for *Thief of Time*. "Bikkit! Wanna bikkit!"
- 9. The Six of Crows duology by Leigh Bardugo: Criminal mastermind Kaz Brekker and his crew must break into the most secure fortress in their world, to rescue a scientist whose invention could wreak havoc. In the second book, the crew is out for revenge, with their whole city pitted against them.
- 10. *Neverwhere* by Neil Gaiman: A young businessman discovers a secret world below the streets of London, a labyrinth full of angels and monsters. There, he must help a noblewoman save her kingdom from destruction.
- 11. *The Bear and the Nightingale* by Katherine Arden: a many-layered tale of a family living at the edge of the Russian wilderness. Vasya's new stepmother tries to remake the family's whole life, while evil from the forest creeps closer to their village. Starts a trilogy.
- 12. The Hollow Kingdom trilogy by Clare B. Dunkle: The goblin king kidnaps Kate to be his bride, and her younger sister Emily comes along. The second and third books feature elves and their longstanding feud with the goblins, which may reignite into full-blown war.
